
CAMP AT SPRING BLUFF SUMMER 2024

THINGS YOU SHOULD KNOW ABOUT CAMP

STAFF

Our staff is made up primarily of volunteers from the churches in the Twin Rivers Baptist Association who give their time in God's service.

ILLNESS

If a camper becomes ill, the parents will be contacted to come for the child. In case of an emergency injury or illness, the camp administration will use their judgment about taking the child to a local physician or hospital. In accordance with our insurance the camper will be transported by ambulance. In general, accidental injuries are covered by camp insurance after any insurance you may have has paid.

MEALS

Campers will enjoy well balanced meals and snacks prepared and served by an excellent kitchen staff. Three meals a day and snack will be provided so additional snacks are not necessary.

ATTITUDE

All campers should maintain a Christlike attitude throughout camp, displaying traits such as obedience, integrity, kindness, and respect.

ATTIRE

All articles of clothing should be appropriate for a church camp atmosphere. Please use best judgement when packing, any dress code issues will be determined by camp director. Tennis shoes and socks are recommended for activities, closed toes shoes are required for all non swimming activities. Swim suits must be covered to and from swimming.

CABIN ASSIGNMENTS

Camp Directors make housing assignments. Please indicate preferred bunk mates on registration form.

MEDICATION

All medications brought to camp must be in original containers, given to and dispensed by the camp nurse.

THINGS NOT TO BRING

Please do not bring items such as: any electronic devices, drugs, alcohol, any form of tobacco, firearms, weapons, or any fireworks. We discourage campers from bringing money or anything valuable to camp.

LEAVING CAMP

If a camper must leave camp for a period of time (ball games, doctor appointments, etc.) the director must be notified in writing the first day of camp. when and by whom the camper will be picked up and returned to camp.
